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SOURCE A

A cartoon, published in 1954, from the British magazine, 'Punch'.

Punch was a popular magazine which often used humour to comment on life in Britain and abroad at the time. It also sold many copies in British colonies. In 1953, Punch appointed a new editor who employed cartoonists with a harsher, more critical view of British life.

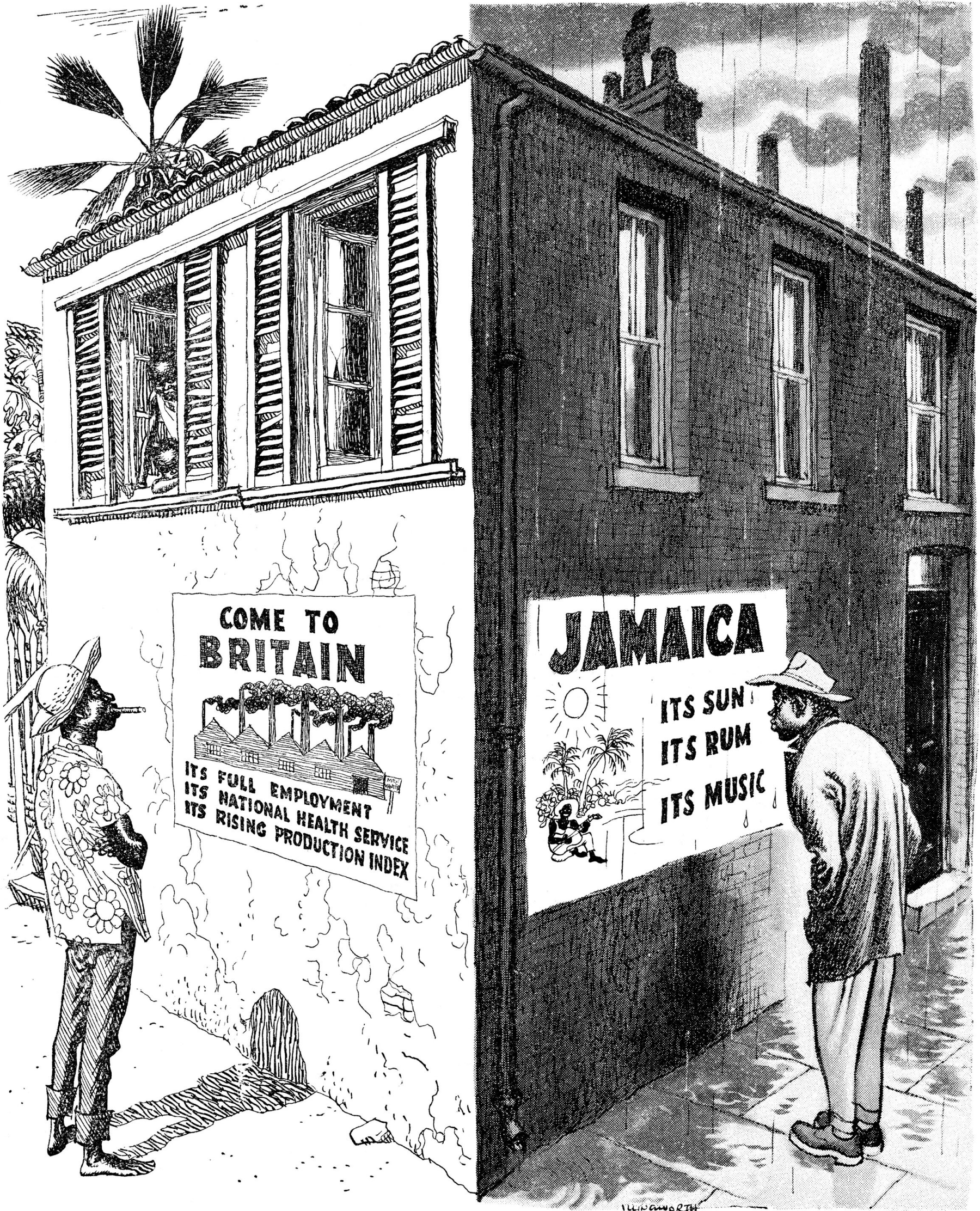
The cartoon, on page 5, shows two sides of a house.
