From the Proclamation of the Irish Republic, 24 April 1916, read from the steps of the General Post Office by Patrick Pearse, one of the leaders of the rising.

We declare the right of the people of Ireland to the ownership of Ireland. The long seizure of that right by a foreign government has not extinguished the right, nor can it ever be extinguished except by the destruction of the Irish people. We hereby proclaim the Irish Republic as a Sovereign Independent State. And we pledge our lives and the lives of our comrades-in-arms to the cause of its freedom, and of its exaltation among the nations. We place the cause of the Irish Republic under the protection of the Most High God, whose blessing we invoke upon our arms, and we pray that no one who serves that cause will dishonour it by cowardice, inhumanity or robbery.
