Study the source below and answer the questions that follow:

Source

The DUP has been accused of planning to kill off a proposal to ban Assembly Members from double-jobbing – holding two elected posts at the same time. A Private Members Bill banning double-jobbing has been steered through the Assembly by independent MLA Dawn Purvis and is awaiting final passage. She predicted the DUP would halt it by making it a “Petition of Concern”, meaning cross community support in the Assembly would be required. The DUP’s strength in the Assembly means the Bill would not get the necessary level of unionist support.
