2 Footage of an attack on a man in a wheelchair was screened in cinemas recently by Scope to highlight physical assaults on people with disabilities. The clip highlights the fact that disabled people are four times more likely to be assaulted than non-disabled people. The graphic images depict a fictional incident in which an assailant kicks and punches the disabled man before leaving him lying on the ground. Jon Sparkes, chief executive of Scope, said violence had become a part of “disabled people’s everyday lives. . . . It is as real as sexism, racism or homophobia but sadly less people are aware of this kind of discrimination, or indeed outraged by it.”
