- 1 (a) Give an account of the social and political structures which existed in Ireland before the arrival of Patrick. [35]

- (b) With reference to other aspects of human experience, explore the claim that the value of such writings is questionable. Justify your answer. [15]
- 4 (a) Explain how monasticism contributed to the Celtic Church. [35]
- (b) With reference to other aspects of human experience, explore the view that self-denial and asceticism are unnecessary for religious practice. Justify your answer. [15]
