U2 and Rolling Stones to Play Derry?

U2 and The Rolling Stones are being considered as headline acts to launch Derry-Londonderry's City of Culture Year in 2013.

Organisers of the year-long schedule of events are even considering asking 1970s punk heroes The Clash to re-form for the event.

Derry defeated four other British cities to be nominated as the UK's first City of Culture.

In 2013, the city will host a series of high profile events. These are expected to include the annual Brit Awards and the BBC's Sports Personality of the Year awards.

City of Culture spokesman, John McCafferty says organisers hope to launch the year with a massive outdoor concert at Derry's Ebrington site.

It could be a case of “Londonderry Calling” as punk band The Clash may reform to launch Derry’s City of Culture year in 2013.

The 1970s punk outfit is one of a number of world-class bands in line for a City of Culture call-up in January 2013. Others being considered include U2 and the Rolling Stones.

Derry-Londonderry has been nominated as the UK’s first official city of culture after defeating Birmingham, Sheffield and Norwich to secure the title for 2013.

City of Culture leaders in the city are planning a year-long schedule of major events.

City of Culture spokesman, John McCafferty said it was hoped to launch the year with a culture extravaganza.

“One of the options we’re considering is having a major concert at Derry’s Ebrington site which can be accessed by the new peace bridge across the River Foyle.

“We would see this as setting the scene and indicating the type of activities which will take place during 2013,” he said.

Mr McCafferty said a number of leading bands and performers were being considered for the gig including U2 and the Rolling Stones.

“I know The Clash broke up in 1986 but they have performed a few reunions.

“We thought that their biggest hit, “London Calling” would connect with the whole Derry-Londonderry City of Culture thing,” Mr McCafferty said.

Derry, Londonderry or just LegenDerry, there’ll definitely be something special in the city on the Foyle in 2013.
