### **SOURCE A New Citizens Living in Northern Ireland**

In Northern Ireland individuals and groups may have strong views which are different for example, about culture, religion or politics. It is important that everyone in society is tolerant of others. This helps to reduce tension between different groups and can help to build trust and good relationships.

Some people may be prejudiced against others such as, those of a different religion. This may be because they do not know enough about the other group or their religion. Their prejudice may be influenced by others and the media. This can lead to intolerance and discrimination.

People who come to Northern Ireland from other countries are often seen as new citizens. They include immigrants from China, Croatia, Poland, India and Pakistan. They contribute to Northern Ireland's society by enriching its cultural diversity and to its economy by bringing new skills and working in jobs where there is a skills shortage.

However, new citizens may face prejudice and discrimination. One reason is that some local people think these new citizens are taking their jobs and that they are not entitled to public resources such as health care and housing.
