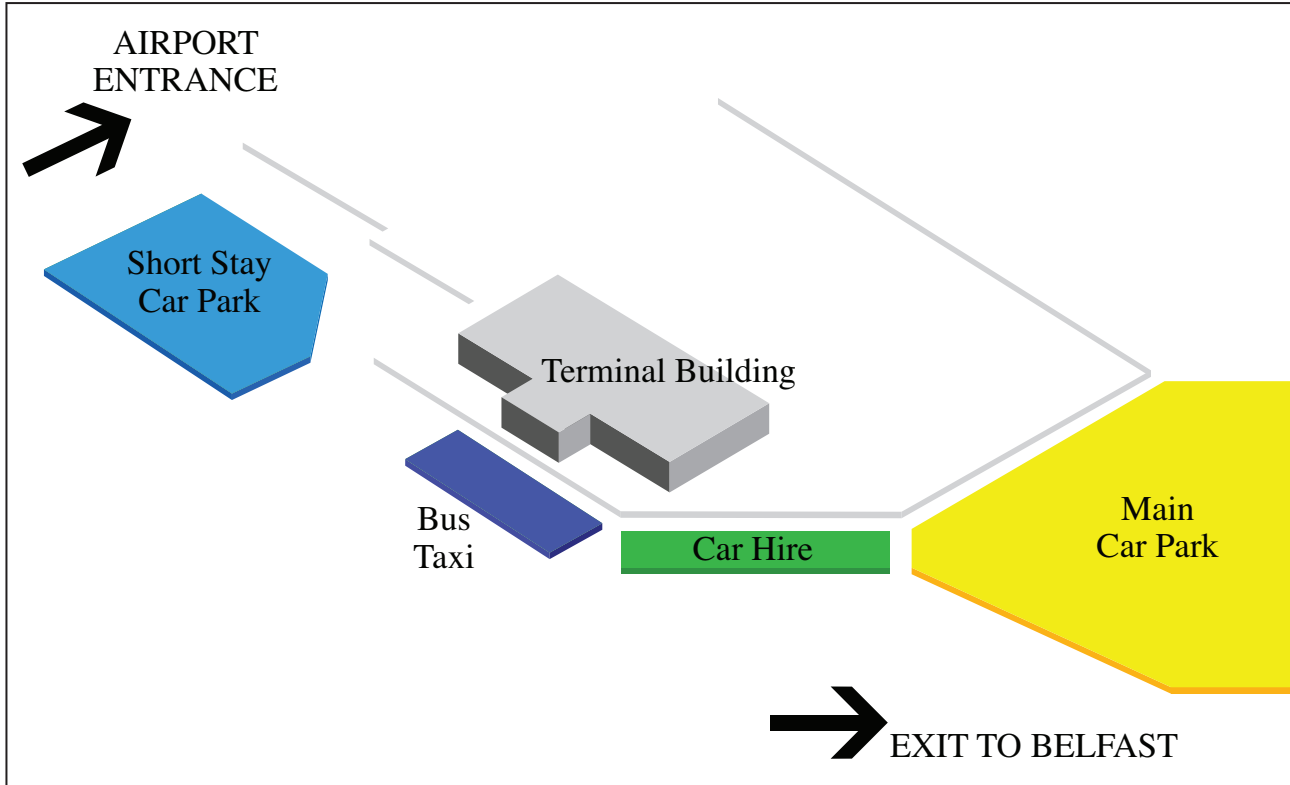

George Best Belfast City Airport Layout



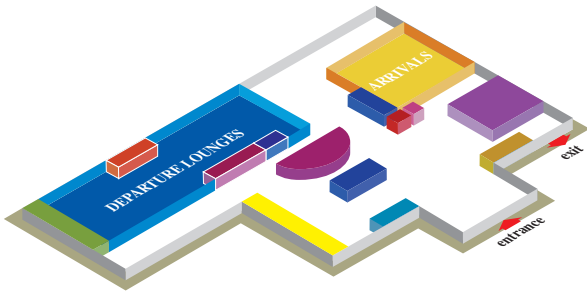

Layout of Terminal Building

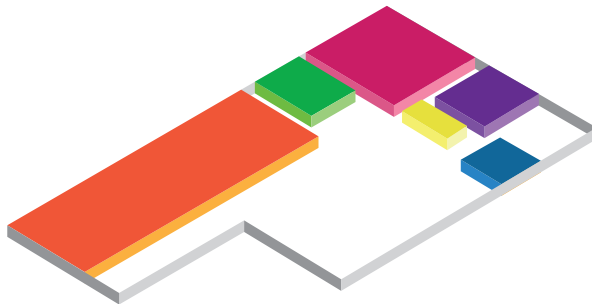
