- (b) Examine the account in Acts of Philip's meeting with the Ethiopian official which led to the official's conversion to Christianity. [10]
- (c) 'Philip's contribution to the development of Christianity was greater than that of Stephen.' Discuss this claim. [10]

- 2 (a) Outline the mission of Paul and Silas to Beroea. [5]
- (b) Explain why Paul and Silas left Thessalonica. [10]
- (c) 'Paul's missionary journeys would have been more successful if he had not preached the gospel in synagogues.' Discuss this view. [10]
