





A section of the Trans-Alaska crude oil pipeline, USA, an HIC in North America, 2017



Contribution of tourism to world GDP, by type of spending, 2016

Type of spending	Spending (%)
Direct spending by tourists	30.3
Purchases of domestic goods and services directly by tourist industry	36.6
Investment by tourist industry	8.4
Government spending on services linked to tourists	6.7
Spending by people directly or indirectly employed in tourism	18.0
