

4 To what extent is Vishista Advaita Vedanta a dualist philosophy?

- **5** Evaluate the claim that Jain teachings about the nature of the human person are the same as Hindu teachings.
- 6 'The Four Noble Truths are the only teaching necessary to guide Buddhists to nirvana.'
  Discuss.
- 7 'The only thing separating Buddhism from Hinduism is the concept of anatta.'

Assess this claim.

- 8 Assess the claim that Vishnu himself is **less** significant for Hindus than his avatars.
- **9** Compare the significance of Lakshmi and Durga in the everyday lives of Hindus.
- 10 'Puja allows the living presence within the murti to communicate with the worshipper.'Evaluate this claim.

- **11** Assess the claim that the varna system is vital to Hinduism.
- **12** Discuss the view that all four ashramas are of equal importance in Hindu society.
- 13 'Nothing matters more than good karma.'

Discuss this statement.
