- (a) Explain why Louis XVI recalled the Parlements at the start of his reign in 1774. [10]
- (b) To what extent did internal divisions cause the counter-revolutionaries to fail in the period from 1790 to 1795? [20]

**2 Liberalism and nationalism in Germany, 1815–71**

- (a) Explain why the Treaty of Prague, 1866, increased Prussia's power in Germany. [10]
- (b) 'The humiliation of Olmütz weakened German nationalism.' How far do you agree? [20]

**3 The Russian Revolution, 1894–1921**

- (a) Explain why the Kronstadt rebellion of 1921 happened. [10]
- (b) 'The opposition to the Tsarist regime in the period from 1906 to 1914 was **not** a serious threat.' How far do you agree? [20]

**Section B: American option****The history of the USA, 1820–1941****4 The origins of the Civil War, 1820–61**

- (a) Explain why the Republican Party grew rapidly after its foundation in 1854. [10]
- (b) 'Attempts at compromise after the 1860 election were bound to fail.' How far do you agree? [20]

- (a) Explain why foreign powers had an impact on the Civil War. [10]
- (b) 'Grant's reconstruction policies failed.' How far do you agree? [20]

**6 The Gilded Age and Progressive Era, 1870s to 1920**

- (a) Explain why there was concern about the growth of trusts in the late nineteenth century. [10]
- (b) 'The Progressive Movement failed to improve the lives of ordinary Americans.' How far do you agree? [20]

**Section C: International option****International history, 1870–1945****7 Empire and the emergence of world powers, 1870–1919**

- (a) Explain why the United States began an extensive modernisation of its navy in the late nineteenth century. [10]
- (b) 'The Second Boer War made little difference to Britain's relations with other European powers.' How far do you agree? [20]

**8 The League of Nations and international relations in the 1930s**

- (a) Explain why Italy's relations with Britain and France changed after 1934. [10]
- (b) 'It was the departure of key nations that left the League of Nations powerless in the 1930s.' How far do you agree? [20]

**9 China and Japan, 1912–45**

- (a) Explain why attempts to form a stable government in China between 1912 and 1916 were unsuccessful. [10]
- (b) How far was the failure of democracy in Japan a result of the Great Depression? [20]
