- 3 Assess the strengths and limitations of quantitative research methods. [25]
- 4 Assess the arguments for using non-participant observation rather than participant observation in sociological research. [25]

Section C: Social Differentiation and Stratification

- 5 “Gender socialisation is the main factor explaining why males earn more than females in modern industrial societies.” Explain and assess this view. [25]
- 6 “The working class that Marx wrote about no longer exists in modern industrial societies.” Explain and assess this claim. [25]
