1 Still Life Group

> (a) Laundry in the process of being ironed. The arrangement should include an iron, Either ironing board and clothes basket.

> Or (b) A group which expresses the theme of a birthday party. Items may include a cake, presents, birthday cards and wrapping paper.

Natural and Man Made Objects 2

Make a study **or** studies from **one** of the following alternatives:

Either (a) Two belts with intricate buckles.

Or **(b)** A selection of root vegetables with their leaves.

Or **(c)** A section of tree branch which is entwined with tangled foliage.

3 The Human Figure

(a) A person is seated, fastening their shoe. The whole figure should be drawn or painted.

Or (b) A composition in which one person is sitting and trying on a pair of shoes. A second figure is kneeling and helping.

Or (c) A portrait study of a person who is seated in front of a mirror brushing or combing their hair. The study should include the head, upper body and hands.

Candidates may carry out their final examination work in the studio with the aid of their preliminary sketches and/or own photographs for the following question.

(a) Washing hanging on a line. Either

Or **(b)** A view through a gap in a hedge or fence.

Or (c) A passageway or a corridor.

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
