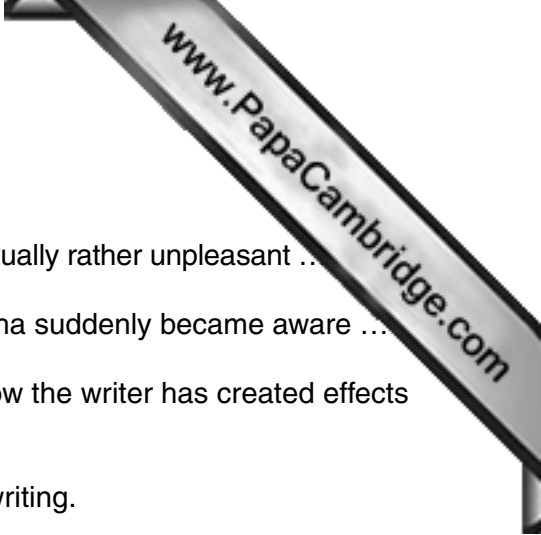

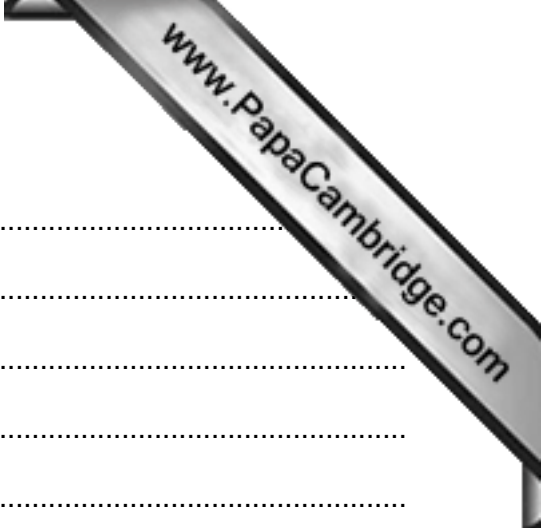
3 Summarise:

Up to 15 marks are available for the content of your answer, and up to 5 marks for the quality of your writing.

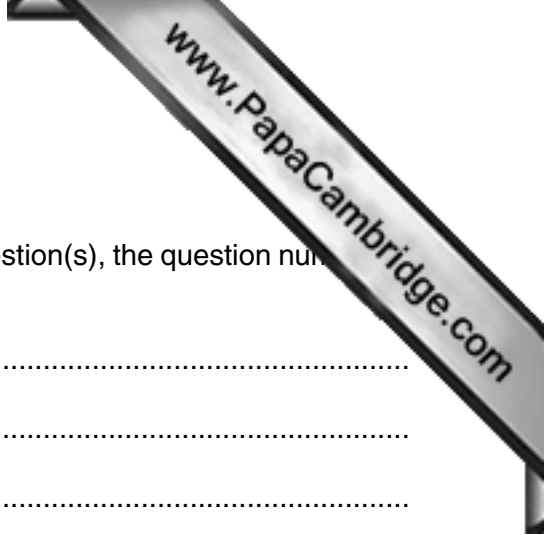


Handwriting practice area with 20 horizontal dotted lines.

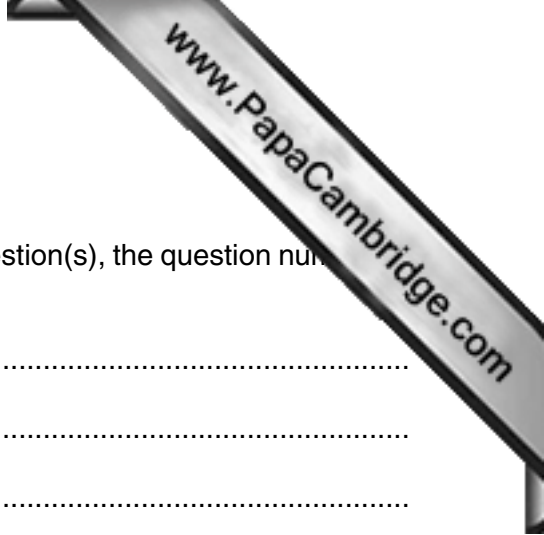
