3 Study Source C.

How reliable is this source about the experiences of miners during the California Gold Rush? Explain your answer using details from the source **and** your knowledge. [7]

4 Study Sources D and E.

Why do these sources differ in their attitude towards controlling land? Explain your answer using details from the sources **and** your knowledge. [10]

5 Study all the sources.

"Settlement of the land was the main factor that drove westward expansion." To what extent do you agree? Explain your answer using details from **all** the sources **and** your knowledge. [15]

Depth Study B: The Women's Suffrage Movement 1866–1920

Read the background information and then answer all the questions. Use your knowledge of the topic to help you interpret and evaluate the sources, as appropriate.

The campaign for female suffrage before 1890 faced many obstacles. One of the major areas of concern was over the organization of the movement.

Depth Study C: The United States and the World 1880–1917

After 1890 the United States became more directly involved in relationships with other countries. The reasons for this increased contact varied.

American society experienced change in the decades after the Second World War. While some Americans embraced the changes, others were more reluctant to do so.
