

MARK SCHEME for the October/November 2006 question paper

0580 and 0581 MATHEMATICS

0580/02 and 0581/02 Paper 2, maximum raw mark 70

TYPES OF MARK




Most of the marks (those without prefixes, and 'B' marks) are given for accurate results, drawings or statements.

- **A** marks are given for an accurate answer following a correct method.


