
Question 1

The diagram shows that 36 million people listen to the BBC's World Service Radio programmes.


(a) The number of listeners for 'SE Asia and the Pacific' is missing from the diagram. Work out the missing number.





TYPES OF MARK

Most of the marks (those without prefixes and 'B' marks) are given for accurate results, drawings or statements.

'M' marks are awarded for any correct method applied to the appropriate numbers.

^{&#}x27;B' marks are given for a correct statement or step.

^{&#}x27;SC' marks are awarded in special cases.

^{&#}x27;A' marks are for accurate results or statements but are awarded only if the relevant 'M' marks have been earned. The symbol ' $\sqrt{}$ ' indicates that a previous error is to be 'followed through' i.e. the mark can be gained if the candidate has made no further error in obtaining the relevant result.
