Drawing and/or Painting from a Living Person

- 1 The model lies on a small bed or couch. One leg is slightly bent at the knee. One arm rests across the stomach while the other is placed down the side of the body.

*Candidates should be instructed that they are to make a study of the whole figure. They may **also**, if they wish, include studies of other details such as the head or hands. These may be completed on an additional sheet.*

- 2 The model sits at a table with a phone to their ear and holding a document in their other hand.

*Candidates should be instructed that they are to make a study mainly of the head. They may **also**, if they wish, include extra studies of details such as the head or hands. These may be completed on an additional sheet.*
