- (ii) State what the Lord said he would give to Abram's offspring **and** how Abram responded to this promise. [2]
- (b) Explain what Christians might learn from this passage about God's overall plan for humanity. [6]
- (c) To what extent does the book of Genesis have any relevance for Christians today? [8]
