		(i) why Peter and John were arrested after this healing, and
		(ii) how Peter responded to the order not to speak any more in the name of Jesus. [6]
	(c)	'Peter is the person most responsible for the spread of the church.'
		To what extent do you agree? Show in your answer that you have considered more than one point of view. [8]
3	(a)	Relate the events that led to the conversion of the Ethiopian eunuch. [6]
	(b)	Philip was one of 'the seven'. What do we learn about how these men were selected and their responsibilities? [6]
	(c)	'The conversion of Saul was very different from the conversion of the Ethiopian eunuch.'
