- 6 How effective were the activities of abolitionists in the period c.1820–1860?
- 7 'The personality of President Jackson was the dominant feature of politics in the United States from 1829 to 1837.' Do you agree?
- **8** 'John Brown's Raid was the most important cause of the breakdown in relations between North and South in the years 1859–1861.' Discuss.
- **9** What was Lincoln's most important quality as president?
- **10** 'The disadvantages of westward expansion in the nineteenth century outweighed the benefits.' Did they?

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Section 3: 1865-1921

- 11 'The Reconstruction period, 1865 to 1877, witnessed significant progress for African Americans.'
 Discuss.
- 12 'The main weakness of the Populist movement was a lack of effective leadership.' Discuss.
- 13 In what ways, if any, was the United States a 'great imperial power' by 1914?
- 14 How significant were the achievements of the presidency of Theodore Roosevelt?
- 15 Was his policy of neutrality in the First World War the main reason why Wilson won a second term as President in November 1916?

Section 4: 1914-1953

- 16 'Prosperous only on the surface.' How valid is this judgement on the United States in the 1920s?
- 17 How successful was the New Deal in addressing the economic problems of the USA?
- **18** 'Air power was the most important contribution of the United States to the Second World War.' Discuss.
- **19** 'The Berlin Blockade was the greatest foreign policy challenge faced by President Truman.' Discuss.
- 20 What best explains the extent of support for McCarthy in the years 1947–1953?

Section 5: 1953-2008

- 21 'Persistent misjudgement characterised the foreign policy of President Eisenhower.' Discuss.
- 22 'Unsuccessful in his domestic policy.' Discuss this judgement on President Kennedy.
- 23 Was the Tet Offensive of 1968 the turning point in the Vietnam War?
- 24 What best explains why Carter lost the presidential election of 1980?
- 25 Assess the view that the presidency of Clinton was one of limited achievement.

- 27 What best explains hostility in the USA to immigration in the period c.1840–c.1920?
- 28 'In the years 1848–1917 there was little significant change to the status of women in US society.' How valid is this judgement?

- 30 What best explains the rise of an imperial presidency in the period 1933–1974?

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
