



# AS/A Level

### **Government and Politics**

(Available for teaching from September 2008)

This specification examines the structures of authority and power in the UK – legislature, executive and judiciary – and how these differ from those of other political systems. Candidates develop a critical awareness of the nature of politics and the relationship between political ideas, institutions and processes.



## What are the benefits to me and my students of delivering this OCR specification?

- It's up to the minute based on consultation between QCA, senior OCR Government and Politics examiners, feedback from existing centres and market research
- The ethos and strengths of OCR's previous specification have been maintained in a new four unit (two at AS level, two at A2) format
- The assessment burden is cut by removing the examined coursework element

- Candidates are encouraged to engage with contemporary politics and current political debates
- Candidates require a basic working knowledge of concepts like democracy, participation and representation as well as being aware of current political developments.

| Contemporary<br>US Government<br>and Politics | Candidates will gain an understanding of the government and politics of the US. They will examine the US constitution, legislature, executive and judiciary of the federal government as well as issues concerning representation and participation.  | Optional (but if chosen both units in the option must be taken) |
| Political Ideas and<br>Concepts               | Candidates will explore and compare a range of political ideas, democratic theories and systems. They will explore the role of the state, the processes of government and the relationship between individual and state in society. Candidates will be able to refer to a range of political thinkers.  | Optional (but if chosen both units in the option must be taken) |
| US Government<br>and Politics                 | In this unit candidates apply skills and knowledge gained in other areas of the Advanced GCE course to compare and contrast UK, American and EU political systems. Candidates are expected to supplement formal study with close attention to world political events via relevant media. Candidates are encouraged to make references beyond the UK, US and EU. | Optional (but if chosen both units in the option must be taken) |
| Political Ideas and<br>Concepts in Practice   | In this unit candidates apply their knowledge and understanding of political ideas and concepts to the practice of politics in the UK and the EU. They will study a range of political theories, thinkers and systems. Candidates are expected to pay close attention to world political events via the relevant media.   | Optional (but if chosen both units in the option must be taken) |

All units are assessed through a timetabled written examination.
